Community Education

Each year MOCSA educates hundreds of community groups, businesses, schools, faith-based organizations and other social service agencies on key issues related to sexual assault. All programs include information on personal safety and risk reduction with a typical length of 45-60 minutes. Programs are free and available in English or Spanish.

Child Sexual Abuse

Preventing child sexual abuse takes the efforts of an entire community and the crime can leave victims, families and friends feeling helpless and confused. In this presentation participants will learn the root causes of child sexual abuse, how to prevent it, and what they can do if someone they know has been a victim or perpetrator of child sexual abuse.

Sexual Assault

In this presentation participants will learn the definitions of sexual assault, date and acquaintance rape. Additional topics include dating rights, consent laws, drugs used to facilitate rape, and commonly accepted myths about rape. Safety, prevention, and resource information will also be discussed.

Human Trafficking

Kansas City is a thoroughfare for victims of trafficking, both foreign and domestic. In this presentation participants will learn the definition of human trafficking, its prevalence locally and nationally, how to spot it, and what they can do to prevent others from becoming victims of human trafficking.

Sexual Abuse & Persons with Disabilities

Persons with disabilities are at an especially high risk of being sexually abused or assaulted. In this presentation participants will learn how sexual assault specifically impacts this population and how society can safeguard against it. This presentation includes tips for both persons with disabilities and their caregivers.

Media Safety

This presentation focuses on how sexual violence can be further perpetrated through internet sites such as Facebook and Twitter and other media outlets. Participants will discuss forms of internet harassment including cyber bullying and sexting and safety tips to reduce on-line vulnerability. This program may be particularly helpful for parents, teachers or youth groups.

Elder Abuse

Physical impairments, neurological difficulties and isolation are just some of the risk factors associated with sexual abuse later in life. This presentation works with the elderly, their loved ones, and their caregivers to help create a safe environment for this population and to let victims know that they are not alone.

Man Up!

Men and boys play an important role in preventing sexual assault. MOCSA's Man Up! programming includes workshops for parents, school, community or faith-based presentations.
