MOCSA is an award winning employer with a commitment to innovation, evidence-based practices and trauma stewardship. We are seeking a Licensed Clinical Social Worker to provide supervision of evidence based treatment for community members who have been impacted by sexual abuse and assault.

SUMMARY

This position is responsible for program coordination in the provision of counseling services for community members who have been impacted by sexual abuse and assault.

JOB OBJECTIVES

I. Client Services (35%)

- a. Provide evidence based individual, family and group counseling to youth with sexual behavior problems, survivors of sexual violence and significant others at MOCSA offices and outreach sites.
- b. Provide case management including coordination of services with child protective, legal and community collaterals.
- c. Complete all client documentation.
- d. Ensure quality service delivery and achievement of department goals and objectives.

II. Program Coordination (10%)

- a. Assists with program development and implementation.
- b. Assists with grant monitoring, reporting and evaluation procedures.
- c. Coordinates case review process including selecting and assigning case files for review and monitoring necessary changes.

III. Supervision (50%)

- a. Provides leadership to the Counseling team and MOCSA at-large.
- b. Supervises one or more of the following positions; Intake Specialist, Therapists, Interns and Volunteers.

IV. Community Education (3%)

- a. Provides community education and professional training.
- V. **Crisis Intervention (2%)**
 - a. Provide back-up support for 24-Hour Crisis Line, hospital advocacy and law enforcement advocacy.
- VI. **Media (1%)**
 - a. Serve as a representative of MOCSA including written, recorded, videotaped and photographed images, voice and name in online, video and printed publications.

The responsibilities described represent the primary responsibilities of the job. Other responsibilities may be assigned by the supervisor as warranted by business needs. The incumbent is expected to do all assigned responsibilities.

KNOWLEDGE/SKILLS/LICENSURE/CERTIFICATION

Minimum Qualifications

Must be eligible to provide clinical supervision to social workers seeking licensure. Experience working with individuals who have experienced trauma. Training and or certification in Evidence Based Practices such as EMDR, TF-CBT, or CPT or registration as a Play Therapist.

Preferred Qualifications

Experience with working with customized databases. Experience supervising social workers. Bilingual Spanish.

Candidates who do not meet preferred qualifications will be not be disqualified from the application process.

PHYSICAL AND MENTAL DEMANDS

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this class. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

Physical Demands

Work is typically performed in an office environment. While performing the duties of this job, employees are regularly required to sit, walk and stand; talk or hear, both in person and by telephone; use hands repetitively to finger, handle, feel or operate standard office equipment; reach with hands and arms; and lift up to 25 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision and the ability to adjust focus.

Mental Demands

While performing the duties of this job, employees are regularly required to use written and oral communication skills; read and interpret data, information and documents; analyze and solve non-routine and complex problems; use math and mathematical reasoning; observe and interpret situations; learn and apply new information or skills; perform highly detailed work on multiple, concurrent tasks; work under intensive

deadlines with frequent interruptions; and interact with faculty, staff, administration, funders, and others encountered in the course of work.

WORK HOURS

This is a full-time position; business hours are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Flexible scheduling, including four day work weeks are available. Regular evening and occasional weekend work may be required as job duties demand.

TRAVEL

Regular travel throughout the Kansas City metropolitan area to perform counseling and outreach services.

BENEFITS

Vacation, Holiday, Sick Pay, Medical, Dental, Life, Long-term Disability Insurance, 403(b) and Cafeteria program. MOCSA is an Equal Opportunity Employer committed to creating and supporting a diverse staff. The salary range for this position is \$50,000 - \$60,000 DOE.
